What can you find out about your local areas history? How has it changed over time?

You can use lots of tools to help you to research this:

- Interview a grandparent /parent /neighbours. (Please do this via phone/video call).

Write down your questions and answers.

- Search the internet for ordinal survey maps, see how they've changed over time.

Explain what you have found out.

- Create a nature trail map of your local area. What would I see if I was to take your walk?
- Create a local landscape poster including labelled plants and animals.
- Create a puppet or mobile of local wildlife animals.
- As part of your daily exercise, walk around your local area. Create a map of significant places around where you live.
- Create your own map of Great Haywood. Write the name of the roads, canals, churches and schools on it.

- Find out about the history of Shugborough Hall. Present the information in an exciting way!
- Create a jingle/song to advertise Shugborough Hall. Try using the tune to 'London's burning' to help.
- Create a PowerPoint of the history of Great Haywood.
- Create a 3D model of building or bridge that I could find in Great Haywood.
- Make a short film about the history of Great Haywood. You could include videos of your interviews, photographs from your walks etc.
